## Baking for Community Service Hours

Hosting a Bake Sale for No Kid Hungry is a great way to make a difference in the lives of hungry children across America, while earning yourself a fast 16 hours, or more, of community service.

**Every year hundreds of students across America host a bake sale, earning them a minimum of 16 hours of community service.** From gathering donations to hosting your bake sale, planning a Bake Sale for No Kid Hungry is a fun way to make an impact in your community while racking up your required community service hours.

While planning your bake sale, and as more and more of your community learn about your efforts, you may find the bake sale morphing into a larger event with local bakery involvement, a silent auction or raffle and even a baking contest. Planning large scale bake sale events can earn you up to 30 hours.

**For 4 years**, Jackie Price, of Derwood, Maryland, set up her "Great Rockville Bake Sale" at her city's annual Memorial Day weekend celebration. She and her friends danced the streets of Rockville Maryland selling delicious goodies and raising awareness for an often overlooked issue, childhood hunger in America. Over the years, Jackie raised more than \$15,000 for Share the No Kid Hungry campaign while earning herself a total of 40 hours of community service each year!



In the weeks leading to her bake sale, Jackie spent hours preparing. She earned herself over 20 community service hours in baking and prep time alone. When you add the hours spent setting up and breaking down the two day bake sale, on top of the 16 hours spent manning the booth, Jackie earned herself over half of the community service hours needed to graduate high school.

### 16 hours in Six Weeks

**1 hour:** registering and setting up your fundraising page

**1 hour:** recruiting your team

**1 hour:** finding a location

**2 hours:** asking for donations

**2 hours:** advertising and spreading the word

**2 hours:** making decorations

**3 hours:** baking

**1 hour:** setting up the bake sale

**3 hours:** hosting your bake sale

**1 hour:** cleaning up the bake sale

**16 hours!**

**Make your event big and earn more hours.**



Bake ahead and freeze the items to sell at your sale.

Ask several local bakeries to get involved and participate as a vendor.

Solicit items to include in a silent auction or raffle.

Host a baking contest.
